This Il be especially helpful if your child	Absences/Late Work Absent work: All make-up work must be completed within the number of days equal to the student's absence, plus one day. For example, a student absent for one day would have two days to complete any assignments missed during the absence. This policy does not apply to long-term projects, which are due immediately upon a student's return to class, or to school-related absences such as field trips, performances, etc. Students are provided a calendar so they are aware of due dates in advance. Students missing class as a result of school- related activities are still required to turn in all assignments on the original due date. It is the responsibility of the student to acquire and complete all make-up work. When absent, students are encouraged to refer to the assignments listed on the class website, to e-mail the teacher, or to call a classmate. Late work: Students are given TWO "Late Work Voucher" per quarter. These vouchers must be attached to the original assignment, and submitted the class meeting after the original due date, in the class "Late Work" Tray. Without a "Late Voucher," assignments submitted one class period late will receive half credit. Essays and projects are docked one full letter grade each day that they are late. "Late Vouchers" MAY NOT be used on projects or long-term assignments.
